

MISSION TRIP WRAP-UP




Mission Trip

I Promise

One of my earliest memories really isn't much of a memory but I remember vividly thinking that my mother took me to Priest School. It seemed a little strange to me that we were not studying church stuff there, though. It might seem like a silly mistake but, the pre-school was at a church so it's a reasonable deduction. I do remember making the assumption that we would surely get on with the Priest training soon enough, maybe after nap time tomorrow? I would think. I think... I guess I was a strange kid but some things never change.

You might assume that one would think mother might not be keeping her promises after a while but small children never distrust their parents. That's a learned response. Jesus used the innocence of children to demonstrate a more perfect trust, a trust like jaded adults are no longer capable. Matthew 19:13-15 One day some parents brought their children to Jesus so he could lay his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples scolded the parents for bothering him. But Jesus said, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children." And he placed his hands on their heads and blessed them before he left.

All of us who follow Jesus Christ and know Him as our Savior, have or have had that kind of faith and trust. Following Jesus Christ means we have to surrender our own will to His. We have to turn to Him while all the world says "Christianity is foolish." To surrender requires trust and faith. Surrendering means stepping out in faith. The good news is, Jesus Christ has never and will never let you down. He is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow. He is always there waiting for us. And He will provide even that faith and trust that we sometimes lack when we just take the first tiny step toward Him. God, The Holy Spirit will even provide the words to pray.

All of us have broken promises, unintentionally and even intentionally, but thank God, He will not ever break His promises to us. Hebrews 13:7-9, 14 Remember your leaders who taught you the word of God. Think of all the good that has come from their lives, and follow the example of their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. So do not be attracted by strange, new ideas. Your strength comes from God's grace, not from rules about food, which don't help those who follow them. For this world is not our permanent home; we are looking forward to a home yet to come.

When I make a promise, I will do my best to keep it because I want to shine the light of Jesus Christ but I will fail from time to time. Jesus will NEVER break the promises He has made. That you can count on.
